Students participated in a camp on Disaster Management at Cheeyambam, Pulpally from 10th July. On 11th July 2016 MSW students of 4th semester were given a class on “Brain wave therapy” by Rev Fr Jose Pandakkal CST. A legal awareness class was given to the whole college on “Anti ragging” on 11th July 2016 at 2.00 pm. On 12th of July 2016 the students attended a seminar on “Inclusive education among children with disability” by Dr. Pavan Antony. An induction and orientation class was arranged for the students of 1 sem BSW and I sem MSW. On 24th September 2016 MSW students attended
